

Seeking the Will of God

In seeking the will of God, we may not try to mirror the actions of those in a Bible account, but we may want to examine the attitudes behind the actions. Look at the attitudes reflected in today's Bible text. Jot a few words about how you can emulate those attitudes.

Prayer—*During his journey the servant prayed that God would make him aware of what he should do (Genesis 24:12).*

Urgency—*When the servant saw the young woman who might have been the answer to his search, the servant wasted no time in meeting her (Genesis 24:17).*

Evaluation—*Once meeting Rebekah, the servant took time to evaluate her, trying to determine if she was suitable for Isaac (Genesis 24: 21).*

Meditation—*Isaac took time to retreat from his daily routine and to consider how he would respond to whatever God chose to do (Genesis 24:63).*

Obedience—*Isaac and Rebekah both looked up. In seeing each other, they also affirmed God's work in bringing them together (Genesis 24:63, 64, 67).*
